Sentence Structure and Phrases

Aller - To go

Je vais	I go/I am going
Tu vas	you go/you are going
Il va/ elle va	he goes/he is going/she goes/she is going
Nous allons	we go/we are going
Vous allez	you go/you are going
Ils vont/elles vont	they go/they are going (masc/fem)

Preposition use with countries depends on the gender

Je vais	I'm going	
au Canada (m)	en France (f)	aux États-Unis (pl)
to Canada	to France	to USA

Sentence Structure and Phrases

The near future tense = I am going + infinitive

Use aller - to go, in the present tense, + infinitive

Je vais aller en France

Je vais faire du camping et je vais nager

I am going to go to France

I am going to go camping and I'm going to go swimming

parce que - because

Cette année, je vais aller au Canada parce que j'adore les montagnes

Cet été, je vais aller en Espagne parce qu'il fait chaud

This year, I am going to go to Canada because I adore the mountains.

I am going to go to Spain because it is hot

To know statements



To know that the near future tense is formed by using the present tense of the verb aller + the infinitive, e.g. je vais manger – I am going to eat.

To know that, when saying you go to a country, the preposition used depends on the gender of the country name: 'en' with feminine singular countries, 'au' with masculine singular countries, 'aux' with countries that are plural.

To understand that gisting a text involves getting an idea of what it is about and doesn't mean understanding every word.

To know different ways to travel to France.

To know how to distinguish between the present and the near future tense.
