Questions for Reflection

During the Video



Watch the video, where you will hear the poem being read to you. There will be some questions to answer during this video. You may choose to write your answers to these questions here. If you decide to do this, pause the video to give yourself time to write.

1. Look at the first verse. Give one question that the poet wants to ask their reflection.

2. Why does the poet feel sorry for their reflection? Explain your answer.

3. Why does the poet think that 'trams are really smart'?

After the Video



Answer these questions after watching the video. Look carefully in the poem for the answers and use what you have learned in the first section.

4. Explain what this poem is about in two or three sentences.

5. Describe the rhyming pattern in this poem.

6. What is the problem when the poet tries to ask all of their questions?

7. What do you think the reflection does when the poet isn't there? Explain your answer.

8. Find and copy three things that the poet wonders about their reflection.

Deeper Reading



9. Come up with an alternative line for the final line of verse 3, which rhymes with 'tricks' and lists things that a reflection could do.

10. Why do you think this poem is called 'Questions for Reflection'? Explain your answer.
