Lesson 4: Friendship Web

WE ARE LEARNING TO: Encourage one another

BORIS ASKS: Can the children encourage their classmates?

RESOURCES: Ball of wool

Sit the children in the circle and explain the rules of circle time:

1. You may only speak when you are holding the ball of wool.
2. Look at the person who is speaking.
3. Listen to what they have to say.

Keeping hold of one end of the wool, roll the ball to a member of the class and say something kind/encouraging about them. Instruct the child to keep hold of a piece of the wool, then roll the rest of the ball to someone else whilst saying something kind/encouraging about the person who is catching it.

Continue until everyone is holding a piece of wool. A web should have been made in the centre of the circle connecting the whole class to one another.

Boris says, 'We are all connected and can be kind to one another.'



HERE ARE SOME WAYS IN WHICH THIS RELATES TO THE CURRICULUM:
